Request for Proposals

The Town of Brookline is requesting bids for the replacement of a 30" metal culvert with a 6'x7'x 45' concrete box culvert on Grassy Brook Road in Brookline, as described in the Hydraulic study, the scope of work and the stream alteration permit.

The project includes all DE-watering, excavation, back fill, replacing disturbed blacktop with 4" of new blacktop. The road may be closed for the duration of the project. The chosen contractor shall contact the Town at least 5 days prior to the start of work, so the Town can notify all affected parties. Work is to be completed by October 30, 2018. Please include approximate start date and job duration that would fit your schedule with your bid.

Bids will be on a lump sum basis, the price must include all associated cost. Please direct questions the Town Office 802-365-4648 or Mark Bills Road Foreman 802-258-1389.

There will be a MANDATORY pre-bid meeting 9:00 AM January 5, 2018 @ the Town Office with a site visit to follow. Hydraulic study and scope of work will be available at that time.

All sealed bids will be received by 6:30 PM on January 17, 2018, at the Brookline Select Board meeting.

Bids will be opened and read aloud. Late, faxed or e-mailed bids WILL NOT be accepted. All bids must include a current proof of workers compensation and liability insurance. The Town of Brookline reserves the right to accept the bid most favorable to the Town, and reject any or all bids.

The chosen contractor shall be responsible for calling DIG SAFE and verifying all utilities (above and below ground) within the project limits, and take necessary precautions to protect utilities during construction.

The chosen contractor shall be solely responsible for repairing and/or paying to repair any damage to private or public property sustained during or as a result of construction activities to its original condition.

It is the chosen contractor's responsibility to comply with all OSHA and VOSHA requirements, maintain a safe job site, and protect the safety of the public.

All work performed by the chosen contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local regulations and requirements.
