Request for proposals

The Town of Brookline is requesting bids for the excavation and installation of five new culverts on Hill and Putney Mountain Roads in Brookline.

Work to consist of saw cutting and disposal of old black top, removal and disposal of existing culverts, excavate and dispose of excavated material, install new Town provided 18" culverts, place Town provided crushed gravel around and over culverts. Crushed gravel to be compacted in lifts not to exceed 12", place 3" of base black top over culverts to match existing grade. All Town provided culverts and gravel will be at the Town shed on Grassy Brook Road, it will be the contractor's responsibility to load and transport these materials. All work is to be completed by July 15, 2017. Please include approximate start date that would fit your schedule with your bid.

There will be a MANDATORY pre-bid meeting held at the Town Office @ 8:00 AM on May 26, 2017. YOU MUST ATTEND THIS MEETING TO BID.

Bids will be on a lump sum basis, the price must include all associated cost including traffic control. One lane of traffic must be maintained at all times on Putney Mountain Road. Affected sections of Hill Rd. may be closed between 8AM and 4:00 PM. Please direct questions to Mark Bills Road Foreman 802-896-6091.

All sealed bids will be received by 6:30 PM on June 7, 2017, at the Brookline Select board meeting. Bids will be opened and read aloud. Late, faxed or e-mailed bids WILL NOT be accepted. All bids must include a current proof of workers compensation and liability insurance. The Town of Brookline reserves the right to accept the bid most favorable to the Town, and reject any or all bids.

The chosen contractor shall be responsible for calling DIG SAFE and verifying all utilities (above and below ground) within the project limits, and take necessary precautions to protect utilities during construction.

The chosen contractor shall be solely responsible for repairing and/or paying to repair any damage to private or public property sustained during or as a result of construction activities to its original condition.

It is the chosen contractor's responsibility to comply with all OSHA and VOSHA requirements, maintain a safe job site, and protect the safety of the public.

All work performed by the chosen contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local regulations and requirements.
